# HOUSE **TRENDS**

1928

Houses lose their uniqueness as mass production takes over • Custom renovations included: hidden storage to hide your alcohol during prohibition • the living room got a facelift • newest thing in kitchen architecture: the breakfast nook!

## 1948

Houses are bigger than they've ever been yet families prefer spending time in the backyard • What is growing in popularity is multiple bedrooms and full bathrooms • The garage is finally **attached** to the house.

#### 1968

Homes now have built in **furniture** and custom entertainment centres • Kitchen appliances are common in the middle-class • Garages are huge • Ceilings are vaulted • Living rooms are sent to the back of the house for privacy.

## 1988

Basements are finally being finished • Bathrooms are carpeted for some reason • The trendiest homes have floral patterns or polished brass • Walls are covered in large mirrors and wallpaper.

## 2008

Beautiful **hardwood** is replacing carpet quickly • Light woods replace what is left of the darker woods • The whiter the kitchen, the classier • Custom accents are being requested now more than ever • A focus on the bathroom calls for spiral showers and vessel sinks.







Trends come and go, and home designs are no exception. Here's a look at the biggest home trends in the last 100 years.

### 1918

The kitchen has a gas stove • You'd be more likely to see freestanding cabinets as opposed to built in cupboards • Wardrobes (not closets) were in basic square bedrooms.

## 1938

Art deco continued from the 20s, with interesting shapes and textures • Clean lines became favourable • For most people, the focus was on practicality • For instance, white became popular because it was easier to see dirt.

# 1958

Cookie-cutter homes are getting bigger and even more popular • The kitchen has a horseshoeshaped counter • Islands appear • The living room is bigger and multi-purpose • For the first time since the 20s the **bungalow** is the home-style of choice.

#### 1978

People are now adding laundry rooms and central air conditioning • Living rooms are sunken • Stairs and mantels get a modern twist • Exposed brick walls are all the rage • Don't forget about all the groovy colours!

#### 1998

Kitchens are the biggest they have ever been • Walk-in closets finally make an appearance • The **fireplace** finally comes back into popularity after being replaced by electric and natural gas heating decades ago.

#### 2018

For the first time, houses are smaller but we still want at least 2 bathrooms • Open floor plans are the defining feature of homes • Garages are turning into she-sheds & basements into man-caves • Popular styles are rustic, French, or retro inspired • The best designers like minimalism and modernism.
